### THE TCCHS ALUMNI FOUNDATION, INCORPORATED IN JULY 2023, COMPLETES ITS SECOND FULL YEAR AS A NON-PROFIT FOUNDATION

---

In May of 2013, several TCCHS alumni who later became the first organizers of the TCCHS Alumni Association met and organized an entity working under the umbrella of a nonprofit foundation originally established by the Todd County Board of Education. Because of the success the TCCHS Alumni Association had experienced in earlier years, officers and directors of the Alumni Association in 2023 began an effort to form their own nonprofit foundation. That effort culminated with the Kentucky Secretary of State’s Office stamping its approval on the Articles of Incorporation and Bylaws of the new Foundation, one called the Todd County Central High School Alumni Foundation, Inc. Those documents were filed on July 12, 2023 with the Kentucky Secretary of State’s Office and on July 17, 2023 at the office of Cindy O’Bryan, Todd County’s County Clerk, thus finalizing the new Foundation becoming legally incorporated. IRS paperwork has also been processed, and the Foundation has continued to move forward with its support of TCCHS, notably in its provision of scholarships to the graduates of TCCHS.

Officers / Directors elected for 2025-2026 at the July 2025 meeting include Anna Jo Parmley, President (Class of 1966); Linda Fritz, Vice-president (Class of 1966); Laura Brock, Treasurer (Class of 1992); and Carolyn Wells, Secretary (Class of 1968). Directors-at-large include Jeremy Long (Class of 1998), Charlotte Morrow (Class of 1968), and Sue Neeble (Class of 1969). ## TCCHS ALUMNI FOUNDATION AWARDS \$43,125 IN SCHOLARSHIPS TO TCCHS CLASS OF 2025!

A total of **20** seniors! A total of **38** scholarships! Thanks to the generosity of so many people – alumni, friends of TCCHS, businesses, the Todd County Fiscal Court, Novelis, other local and area contributors, memberships, and the sale of our alumni items – the TCCHS Alumni Foundation, Inc. presented a total of **\$43,125.00** to the TCCHS Class of 2025 this past Thursday evening, May 8, 2025. This year some of our scholarships provided required a minimum of a 2.75 GPA, others a minimum of a 3.00 GPA, and two others a 3.50 GPA minimum or above. This year also saw one scholarship added that required a 2.50 GPA minimum or above. As true of past years, this year saw new scholarships added, and some other scholarships were eliminated as sponsors were not available. Of interest is the Alumni's first scholarships were awarded in 2014, a short twelve years ago, and this year's scholarship total brings the total monies awarded to seniors of TCCHS to slightly less than **\$255,000** in that 12-year period.

This year also saw the Foundation award our highest scholarship amount. That scholarship, the George and Vicki Hall Kennedy Academic or Technical Scholarship in the amount of \$5000.00, was sponsored by two retired educators, George and Vicki Kennedy, who wanted to give back to Todd Central graduates and to the Alumni Foundation. Three other scholarships this year were made possible through the generosity of folks honoring the late Mrs. Joe Nell Glenn Waters, the late Bruce Marklin, and the late Kelsey Dunn with scholarships in their memory. As you know, Mrs. Waters was a long-time educator not only in Tennessee but also in Kentucky. She also served as principal at TCCHS for several years following her retirement from Tennessee. Friends and family of Ms. Joe Nell donated monies in her memory, and because of the generosity of so many, her scholarship will be funded for several years. Likewise, friends and family of the late Bruce Marklin, well-known police officer and police chief in Elkton, collected monies geared toward a scholarship in his honor. Again, because of the generosity of friends of the late Bruce Marklin, monies were generated to assist a student whose parent was involved with the military or the student had military ambitions or a JROTC background. A third graduate honored was the late Kelsey Dunn, a music educator who lost her life in a traffic accident last year. Her classmates, members of the TCCHS Class of 2013, opted to provide monies for a scholarship instead of flowers and other gifts at the time of her death. Their generosity led to the \$500.00 scholarship in her memory.

We invite anyone who desires to establish a scholarship to reach out to one of us. Our officers/directors this year include Anna Jo Parmley, president; Linda Stokes Fritz, vice-president; Joyce Darby, treasurer; Carolyn Wells, secretary; and Charlotte Morrow, Sue Neeble, and Jeremy Long, directors-at-large. We also ask anyone, either a graduate of TCCHS or a friend of the Foundation, to join our efforts. Memberships are **\$10.00** yearly with a lifetime membership of **\$200.00** also an option. The Foundation has set a goal this calendar year to have 125 members; you can help us reach that goal. Please also

**“AUTHORFEST 2025,” AN EVENT OF SATURDAY, NOVEMBER 8, 2025,  
FEATURED SEVERAL TCCHS ALUMNI AT THE TODD COUNTY  
PUBLIC LIBRARY**

Saturday, November 8, 2025, from 12:00 PM until 3:00 PM saw a gathering of almost 20 area writers converge on the Todd County Public Library (TCPL) for “AuthorFest,” an inaugural event planned to showcase the writings and illustrations of many local and area writers. The event, a collaborative effort with the Todd County Public Library, Friends of the Todd County Public Library, Historic Todd County, Inc. (HTC), and the Green River Academy Preservation Society (GRA), was held in the Community Room

at the TCPL located at 507 South Main Street in Elkton. Amanda Hayes, TCPL's director, emailed, "At TCPL's first 'AuthorFest,' aspiring authors can converse with local published writers and poets. Children can envision their own success in storytelling, poetry, and illustration. Our patrons can celebrate the talent and diversity in literature unique to western Kentucky."

Invited writers and illustrators had on hand copies of their works to sell to the public. As typical of most author showcases, the writers were available to sign their works, and several of the writers offered their books at lower prices. As many Todd Countians are aware, the Green River Academy (GRA) has as one of its goals to promote arts in Todd County, and Historic Todd County, Inc. (HTC) also has as one of its objectives to educate and inform the public about our county's history as well as to commemorate and promote the people of our community. Once someone delves more into the writers of our area, that person will soon discover Todd County and surrounding areas have been and continue to be blessed with a plethora of writers whose talents have led them to pen and illustrate a vast array of literature and art.

- **Charles Leavell**, a 1972 TCCHS graduate, a former Navy communications electrician, and a preacher in Suffolk, Virginia. Charles has penned two books focusing on Todd County Training and the integration occurring in the Todd County School District in 1963. (Because of a funeral at his home church in Virginia, Mr. Charles' sister will be on hand to represent Mr. Charles.)
- **Emilie Gill**, an Elkton resident who teaches illustration classes at APSU. Emilie describes herself as someone who "couldn't decide whether she wanted to be a musician, a zookeeper, a secret agent, or a Professional Adventurer."
- **Frances Strickler**, who resides in Franklin, Kentucky. Frances has penned two books – *A Long Way Home: A Soldier's Story* and *Hardly A Lady*. Her second book is "set in 1930s Kentucky, when women couldn't even open a bank account without a husband or father."
- **Jeff Alan Rogers**, a retired English teacher and poet. Jeff, who loves the poetry of Robert Penn Warren, is a transplant to our area so that he and his wife can be close to grandchildren in Bowling Green. He serves on the Robert Penn Warren Birthplace Museum Committee.
- **Linda Stokes Fritz**, a 1966 TCCHS graduate and a retired educator/guidance counselor. Linda has penned a book dubbed *My Day in Infamy*, one describing a traumatic time in her family's life.
- **Lindsey Sisco**, a second-grade teacher at South Todd who writes books celebrating kindness and diversity. Lindsey describes herself as "a small-town teacher who believes every day holds a story worth telling!"
- **Lisa Lewis Balboa**, another TCCHS graduate and an area church elder and pastor. Lisa is a contributing author to *Leading Ladies: Sharing Our Stories of Inspiration and Faith*.
- **Mike Sears**, a TCCHS graduate, a retired probation and parole officer, and a former MP. Mike is known for adventurous writings appealing to the younger generation.
- **Monica Jobe**, a local writer who gained a love of books early in her life. Her mother-in-law, **Judy Anderson Donnelly**, completed the illustrations in Monica's first children's book entitled *Christian and the Great Journey*.
- **Rosemarie Cowherd Wurth-Grice**, a 1975 TCCHS graduate and a retired English teacher. Rosemarie has penned a poetry chapbook entitled *Darkness Called Us Home*. Rosemarie makes her home on her cut flower farm in Bowling Green.
- **Stephen Smith**, a 2015 TCCHS graduate who teaches at Christian County High School and makes his home in Guthrie. Stephen's writings include seven novels at this time; he also has a passion for gardening.

- **Tammrow Carneal**, a resident of Trenton. Tammrow's book entitled *Silence Me Not: Poems of Love, Hope, Faith, & Inspiration* is "a collection of poems that encourage strength, faith, and love." (Tammrow attended TCCHS her freshman year.)

Over 20 individuals, most with ties to TCCHS, were on hand for the “Slam” that began at 6:00 PM on April 24<sup>th</sup> in the Community Room at the new Todd County Public Library that opened in October 2024. The room, which accommodates up to 200 people standing, saw a focus on the new library as well as on the efforts of the Green River Academy to showcase the myriad talents of Todd Countians and those with Todd County ties. Those participating in the event included Amy Bingham DeCesare, former broadcast journalist at WBKO in Bowling Green as well as a former broadcast journalist in Florida. Currently Mrs. DeCesare, her husband, and her family own The DeCesare Group, a public relations and consulting firm. She also produces a podcast hosted by her husband Jim.

Another graduate and former educator, Rosemarie Cowherd Wurth-Grice, read a selection from her new book of poetry entitled *Darkness Called Us Home*. Kenneth Valentine, great-nephew of the late Carl Hadden and the great-grandson of the late Joseph Newton Hadden of Hadden Mill Road, provided via a video a reading of one of his favorite psalms. Mr. Valentine, a retired Secret Service Agent who was on three Presidential Protection Details, makes his home in Birmingham and is the author of *Cheating Death* and *Staying Sharp*, two books showcasing his life experiences coupled with his faith in God. His mother, Annette Hadden Valentine, is the author of the “My Father” trilogy about her family as well as *Sixty-Six Books of the Mighty Shepherd*, a compilation based upon the Bible.

(Doc) Arnett, a former resident of Todd County and a retired educator and college administrator, was present as well. Dr. Arnett is a graduate of Trenton Elementary. Dr. Amanda Hayes, a native of Hopkinsville, stated in a meeting with the former educators she expected the “Slam” served as an impetus for the public to check out collections of poetry available in the library. Admission to the event, which was from 6:00 PM until 7:30 PM, was free with a donation jar available for those who desired to contribute to the GRA and its mission of rehabilitating the Green River Academy located at 204 Goebel Avenue in Elkton. ## **HAROLD “DOC” ARNETT, GRADUATE OF TRENTON ELEMENTARY, RELEASES *RED CLAY & GREEN FIELDS: THE TODD COUNTY YEARS***

Over 70 people attended the “Poetry Slam” that was hosted on Thursday, April 24, 2025, at the Todd County Public Library. That event, one co-sponsored by the Green River Academy Preservation Society and the Todd County Public Library, saw 21 presenters provide for the audience their choice of poetry, resulting in an evening filled with memories, laughter, music, and fellowship with many folks connected to Todd County both presenting and in attendance. One of those presenters, Harold “Doc” Arnett, has in very recent months published his first book in a series he has titled “West Kentucky Heritage.” His newly released book, *Red Clay & Green Fields: The Todd County Years*, is “an auto-biographical account of growing up on a 250-acre family dairy farm in West Kentucky in the Fifties and Sixties.”


Arnett, who delighted the audience at “Poetry Slam” with both his poetry, his wit, and his music, described his book as a “blend of humor, insight, and raw honesty.” His late father, a Church of Christ preacher in our area for many years, and his mother, described by Arnett as a “pioneer woman mother,” provided the strong foundation Arnett and his siblings gained working on a large dairy farm in the Trenton area. A classmate, Kenneth Adams, penned in describing the book, “With a wisdom born from years of honest reflection, Doc Arnett brings to life the hopes and optimism of youth tempered with lessons learned from the toil and tragedies of growing up in rural western Kentucky during a time and way of life that molded a generation and set the stage for who we are today. It is not only Doc's story; it is our story.”

Arnett also describes his autobiography as one that presents “Dramatic events including seeing a sister nearly burned alive and a brother rushed to the hospital with a heat stroke.” Humor also can be found in his 277-page collection as Arnett recalls skinny dipping in a spring-fed creek, experiencing adventures interrupted by a skunk, and engaging in a walnut war in an old cemetery. He also documents life on the farm resulted in the family’s growing and harvesting their own food, including meat, while dealing with the ordinary challenges of a way of life that has all but disappeared in modern society.

The son of Charlie and Ruby Arnett and one of five siblings, Doc Arnett has a background in public education with many of those years spent at the high school and college level in an industrial arts

classroom. He also has devoted years as a teacher education instructor at Ohio State, a professor at Missouri Western, a principal of an alternative high school in Kentucky, a director of research at Highland Community College in Kansas, a vice-president of academic affairs at Cowley College in Kansas, and a Marketing Director for South Central Regional Medical Center in Arkansas City, Kansas.




